MSEDC Success at the Pryde's Dressage Festival 2016

A lot of planning went into going to the dressage festival held at Werribee in December 2016. Riders from the south east included Natalie Goldsworthy, Ann Dodd, June Whitehead, Kristine Hancock, Sally Toulmin and Cindy Francis. Under lots of instruction from Sue Chandler and Mary Longden, these renowned coaches along with international instructor John Thompson, helped our SE/VIC riders cruise through to a successful riding campaign at Werribee. These long hours of training and instruction time proved successful and ticked off an item on these ladies bucket list.

The weather, most typical of Werribee, proved to be a challenge, however it improved on the Friday and only got better from there. Natalie Goldsworthy competed on her gorgeous Duart Rise Bradman (Flee) in the Elementary on the Friday and the novice on the Sunday with consistently good scores. She did well to remember almost all of her 4 tests with no callers allowed at the championships. Ann Dodd did an amazing job in trying conditions and kept it all together for a great competition under the smooth assistance and guidance from her rock and strapper, Bev Copping. The arenas proved to be a bit of a challenge for dear Weltmaya (Maya) but they overcome the scary judges boxes and hedges to take home a third in the AOR 2.3 Sally Toulmin competed on the elegant Roxleigh Frangelica (Angie) who did a super job of both tests, winning one being an AOR and a second in the other for over-

all medium AOR Runner Up. Cindy Francis had a top weekend on Kings Chorus (King). After his Elementary tests, Cindy didn't bother checking the scores as she was a little disappointed but the judges were happier as they placed her eighth overall in one and was the Elementary AOR champion. Luckily Kris and June could ring her to drag herself back to the presentations to collect her winnings. She then also backed it up with a win and a fifth in the HRCV Jackpot. June Whitehead and Kristine Hancock achieved personal bests riding their trusty steeds, Kinnordy Respighi and HPS Grandeur in the HRCV section of the festival. The atmosphere was a little unsettling for big Gary but was a great experience for this combination and came home with good scores including one of 68.8%. Kristine and (Sphigi) had their first experience in a huge indoor arena but soon settled into the atmosphere doing a very solid test and taking home a 4th, with a huge smile and self accomplishment. They got a third overall and a fourth in another test. All riders enjoyed the experience and watching the other classes. On the Saturday night they watched the Grand Prix Freestyles and some demonstrations. Of course there was the opportunity to shop till they dropped along with some great socialising. Huge congratulations to these ladies on representing our region and coming home with a greater knowledge of a National competition.

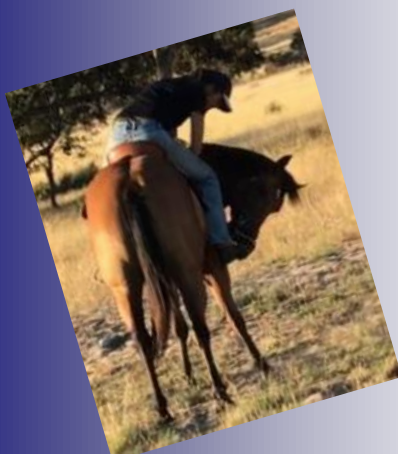

Rider Profile..... Lester Masters!!

He not only has great movement but his temperament is wonderful and he is just a real pleasure to have around, always seeking human company and always happy to work. I would like to continue learning and I hope to take Winter as far as possible up the grades to do justice to his natural ability. We also like to have a little fun jumping and trail-riding. When not busy with the horses, I have lots of other interests. I enjoy being with Julia the most (of course) and we glide over the dance floor together doing some ballroom dancing. I also really enjoy travelling, both here in Australia and overseas, and hope to do lots more. When all this gets too exhausting, you'll find me watching the footy or cricket on TV, or maybe a horsey DVD.
