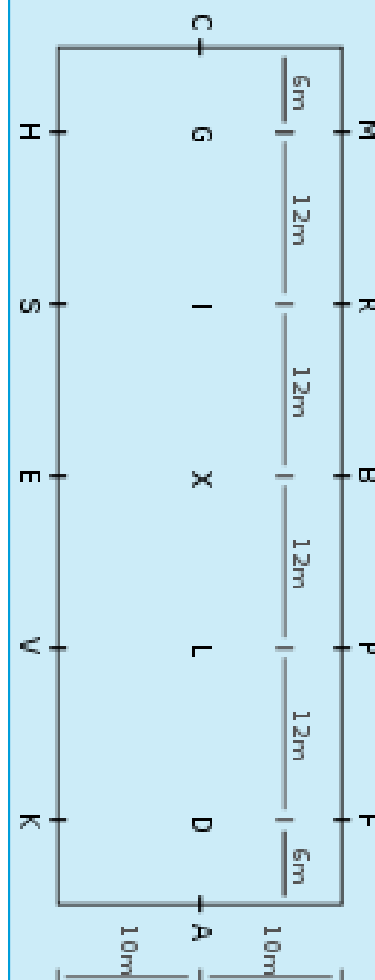

- All competitors must present to the gear check before competing
- Dogs must be on a leash at all times
- The committee reserves the right to cancel or alter any class at their discretion.
- Hot weather times may be used in extreme weather conditions. Notification will be via the MSEDc website
- Current, valid HRCav membership and dressage performance card must be presented to the Event Secretary prior to competing in HRCav classes
- Riders may only compete in a maximum of 3 EA tests per day
- If a rider is eligible to compete in BOTH HRCav and EA tests, then they may only compete in a total of 4 tests in any one day, irrelevant of the test affiliation eg: 2 EA tests and 2 HRCav tests = 4 tests total. This is the maximum.
- HRCav registered club colours must be worn in HRCav tests
- HRCav riders must supply their own numbers for both sides of the horse
- HRCav rules and regulations apply to HRCav tests and HRCav riders
- HRCav riders may compete at their assessed Level and the next higher Level
- HRCav prizes as per Event Rule 25
- EA rules and regulations apply to all other tests and riders
- Anyone who pays a Lucindale PA&H Society membership is eligible to enter the Closed Restricted classes

- **Stock Horse Tests are judged under EA Rules with the exception of saddle, nose bands and dress. Current EA hard hat rules apply.**

“Round the World”

1. Rider to place reins on mounts neck and leader to take full control of mount
2. Rider to remove feet from BOTH stirrups
3. Lift one leg over mounts neck – rider is now sitting sideways
4. Lift one leg over mounts rump – rider is now sitting backwards
5. Lift other leg over rump – rider is now sitting sideways (facing opposite way)
6. Lift leg over mounts neck – rider is now back in normal forward facing position
7. Rider to place feet back in stirrups and pick up reins

“Standing in Stirrups”

1. Rider to place reins on mounts neck and leader to take full control of mount
2. Rider may hold mane, pommel or neck strap
3. Stand forward into stirrups and maintain for 5 seconds

“Aeroplane Arms”

1. Rider places reins on mounts neck and leader to take full control of mount
2. Stretch each arm out sideways whilst maintaining walk
3. Leader to halt mount at G, rider to maintain balance
4. Rider to pick up reins before saluting

Directions for Exercises Test 2

“Round the World”

As above

“Standing in Stirrups”

1. Rider to place reins on mounts neck and leader to take full control of mount
2. Rider may hold onto mane, pommel or neck strap
3. Rider to stand forward into stirrups for 5 seconds

Add in “Aeroplane Arms”

4. Rider to let go of mane, pommel or neck strap and outstretch each arm sideways
5. Maintain for 3 seconds
6. Rider to gently sit back into saddle and pick up reins

“Remove feet from Stirrups”

1. H – whilst maintaining walk, rider to remove both feet from stirrups
2. H-S – maintain walk
3. S – whilst maintaining walk, rider to place both feet back into stirrups

“Standing in Stirrups at Walk”

1. M – whilst maintaining walk, rider to go into standing in stirrups – without pulling on reins to stand up
2. 2. R – whilst maintaining walk, rider to gently sit back into saddle

Dr Davies is a veterinarian, teacher, and research scientist with a life-long interest in communication, posture, and movement, especially in horses and their riders. During the last 45 years she has gradually developed and tested a range of non-invasive ways to encourage improvements in communication, posture, and function, including in individual horses and riders that have congenital or acquired disabilities or damage.

Aside from teaching functional anatomy of the locomotory and nervous systems at Melbourne University's Faculty of Veterinary and Agricultural Sciences, Helen is the leader of the functional anatomy and biomechanics research group and is highly active in equine research projects primarily aimed to maintain soundness in working horses. This seminar contributes to support this research (with part-proceeds also to Horse SA!)
