
Good Luck to those HRCAV members who are competing in the CCC series (Caves Crater Coast) enjoy and do us proud.

KEEPING IT SIMPLE

Competition Arena Errors

There is more than one way to lose marks through making an error - in fact there are 3! They are:

- 1. Error of Test
- 2. Error of Course
- Use of voice

An Error of Test is when the rider, for example, does an incorrect trot sit or rise, a wrong gait, forgets the salute at entry or finish halts, or falls to take the reins in one hand during these halts (see HRCAV Manual Dressage Section 23.2).

The error of test is not given as often as error of course, but should still be applied when noted.

An Error of Course is when a rider deviates from the required pattern, such as going to or from an incorrect marker, making a wrong turn, not being within the required number of steps from the marker for a transition, or omitting a movement.

For example, if a transition from trot to walk is completed at V instead of K, or when trotting up the centre line from A, making a transition to walk at X instead of G, circling at P when it should have been at B, or indeed riding 15m circle when should have been 20m (see HRCAV Manual Dressage Section 23.1).

In these cases, using the bell/horn to stop the rider is at the judge's discretion. The judge may not

sound his/her car horn or ring bell to correct you if there is no likelihood of the error being repeated. For instance, if the test is flowing, and the same error has not been made on the mirror side of the test, then it may be felt best not to interrupt, but still mark an error on the test. Conversely, if the movement is to occur again later in the test, the judge may pull you up to ensure you don't repeat the mistake.

Errors of Test and Errors of Course are cumulatively marked (-2, -4, -8, Elimination).

Use of Voice: Here is the difference from the above two errors. If you use your voice, i.e. by clicking, get-upping, good-boying!, No nono no-ing! etc, this is seen as an incorrect aid to influence your horse. It's tempting to encourage with voice, we all do it at times, at home or at a lesson/rally. However in a test it may cost you valuable marks, so learn to control your eagerness to communicate in any way you can, or to orally vent your frustration.

Marking is also different. The mark that would otherwise have been given for the movement, has 2 points deducted from it each time the judge hears use of voice occur. This can become very expensive! (see HRCAV Manual Dressage Section 24.1.)

For example, if a judge has given you an '8' for your good circle but you were so excited your steed didn't break or buck you've rewarded him with a voiced 'Good Boy', the -2 mark is deducted at the time from the actual movement score (i.e. the 8 is struck out and replaced with a 6). The -2 is not cumulative, but there will still be a -2 for every 'use of voice' in the movement; however it will not be entered or added at end of your test.

Usually, a judge will stop you if you are continuing to use your voice, and set you on the right track to finish your test quietly.

Hopefully this throws a little more light on the issue of errors.

Prior to the event

- riders must be notified if there is only one judge officiating on a competition
- organising committees must notify the SDA in writing when only one judge will be
 officiating

In exceptional circumstances, applications for exemptions from the above rules, must be made in writing to the SDA preferably at least 7 days before the event. The SDA is to report to the EADC when these exemptions are granted.

NOTE:

- this exception does not apply to the number of judges required for State or Australian Championships
- judges may not judge above their accredited level
- for details about judges for Para Equestrian (PE) events please see rule 11.10.1.

When an OC wishes to use a foreign judge who is a national judge in their own country but not an FEI-accredited judge, the OC must provide details in writing and seek the approval of the EADOC.
